hereby agree to renew their partnership in education.

The intent of this partnership is to support student achievement and to provide mutual assistance and benefit through shared time and resources. **The mission statement for this partnership is:**

To promote community collaboration and improve student achievement by supporting teaching and learning in the classroom.

To provide mutual benefit for Mission Bay High School and Mesa College by increasing the coordination of school and college activities, sharing school and college facilities, and working collaboratively to transition students from high school to college.

The effectiveness of our partnership will be measured by:

- Completion of the designated activities.
- Feedback from all participants involved in the partnership activities.
- Consistent and timely communication between the partners.
- Shared goals and expectations.
- Completion of an end-of-year partnership evaluation distributed by the Partnerships in Education Office.
- Active participation in a Partnerships in Education committee that facilitates partnership activities.

The following partnership activities are planned:

- Allowing Mission Bay High School to use Mesa College classrooms, meeting rooms, athletic facilities and parking areas within SDCCD guidelines.
- Providing instructors to teach college level classes at Mission Bay High School.
- Developing career awareness curriculum that will prepare students for the future work force.
- Assisting with matriculation activities on the high school campus.
- Giving Mission Bay High School students enrollment priority within the guidelines of Title V.
- Inviting Mission Bay High School students to college productions and special events.
- Providing Mission Bay High School students with current transfer information by assigning a Mesa College counselor to work with students, faculty, and parent groups.
- Developing several special Mission Bay/Mesa College partnerships that would include:
 - a) Transfer Partnerships
 - b) Interior Design Partnerships
 - c) Graphic Arts Communications Partnerships
 - d) Teacher Preparation Partnerships
 - e) Architecture and Computer Aided Drafting Partnerships
 - f) Technology and Business Application Partnerships

- g) Service Learning Partnerships
- Establishing curriculum improvement conversations between math departments and English departments.
 - Inviting high school students to the Mesa College Transfer Day and the Historically Black University College Day.
 - Providing Mission Bay High School faculty with user cards for the library.
 - Supporting Mission Bay High School's efforts to have every student complete at least one college course before graduation from high school.
 - Sharing staff development resources.
 - Providing Mission Bay High School staff members with opportunities to work at Mesa College as instructors.

In reciprocation and appreciation, the school/program plans the following:

- Mission Bay High School will recognize the partnership.
- Mesa College personnel will be invited to appropriate school activities.
- A partnership column will continue in the school newsletter updating parents and the community on collaborative partnership activities.
- Letters of appreciation/reflection will be written to the partner.
- Mission Bay High School will allow Mesa College to use high school classrooms, athletic facilities and parking areas within SDUSD guidelines.
- Mission Bay High School counseling faculty will consult with Mesa College to ensure that students are well prepared with course requirements, current transcripts, etc.
- Mission Bay High School will encourage students and parents to attend Mesa College.


