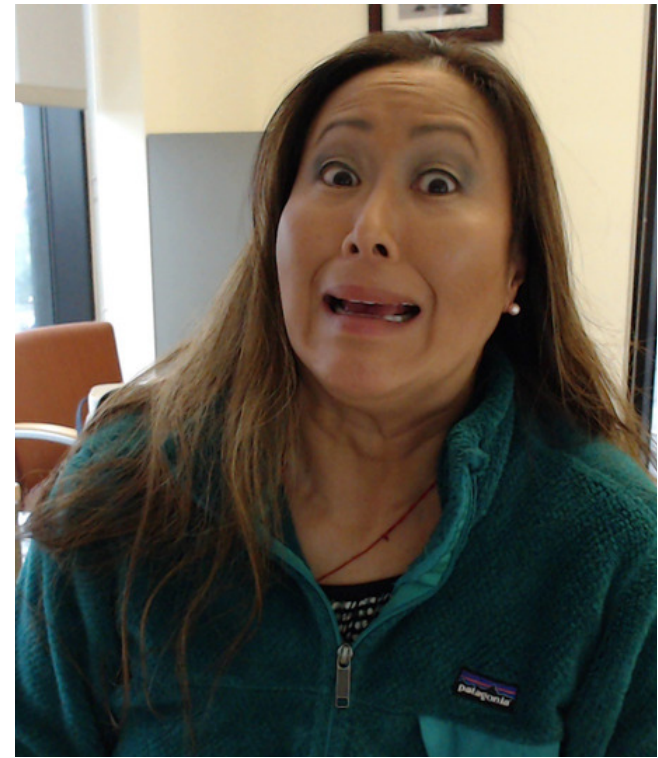

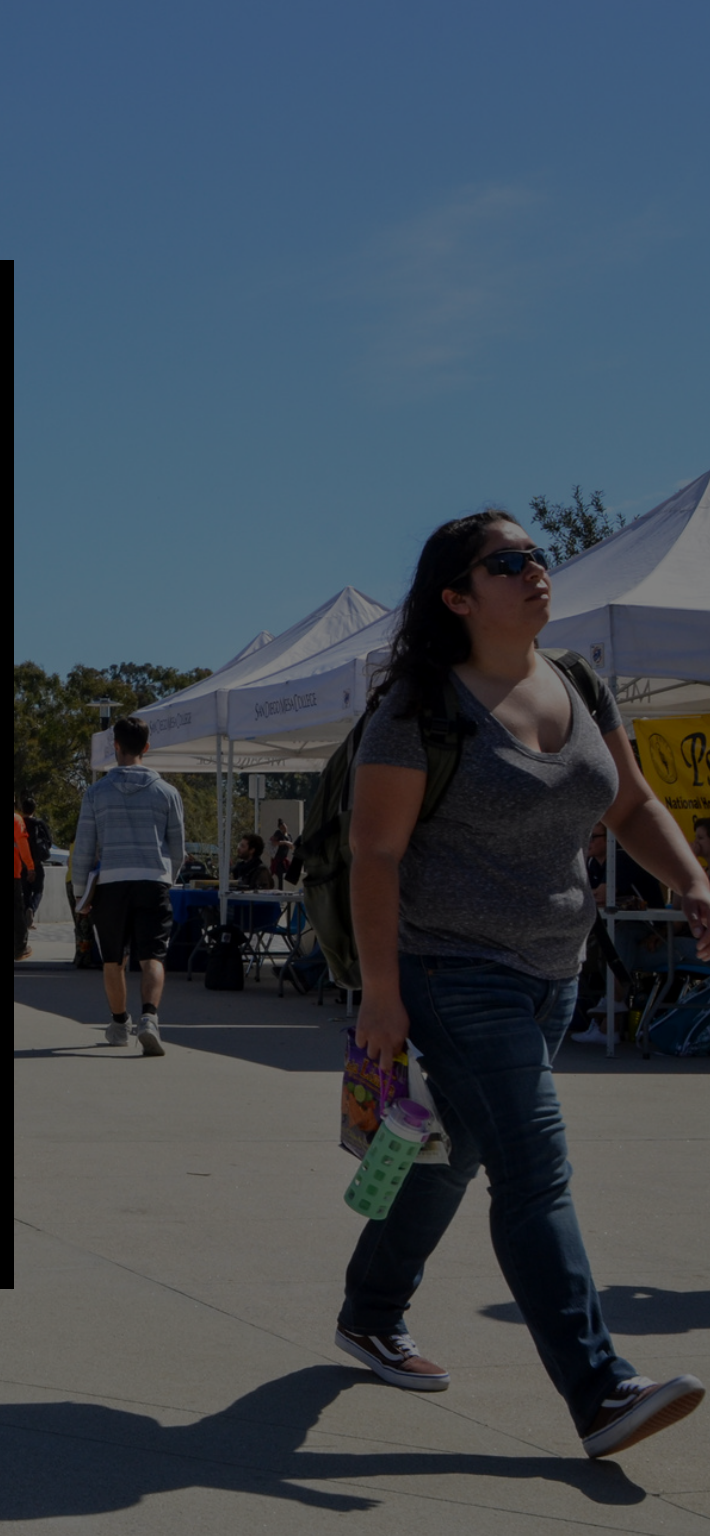
INTEGRATION

2016-2017 Expenditures for BSI, SE, SSSP

- Enhanced flexibility, tools, support, & technical assistance
- 2 full years to expend allocations
- No mid year report required for spring
- Support local flexibility
- Reduced focus on compliance
- Each program retains its own focus
